








Congratulations to the Portville Girls Volleyball team who won the State Championship. Below are some pictures that appeared in the Olean Times Herald upon their return.

GOOD FOR THE GEESE..... (from Dec. Stewardship pamphlet)

Recently, as fall arrived, the air began to cool, leaves started falling from trees, and high overhead geese began honking. Looking up, you could often see that they were flying south in the famous V-shaped formation.

But why do they fly in that pattern? Scientists believe that they do it to help each other. When one bird flies at the tip of the V, it cuts air resistance to those flying behind it. It's harder work for the leader to fly in this position, but easier for its followers.

Of course, it would be difficult for one goose to be the leader over a migration that might be many hundreds of miles long. However, geese take turns, so that no one is pushed too hard.

Every congregation has its leaders; hard-working men and women who organize activities such as a church school or a Thanksgiving food drive. But because what they do is often time-consuming, it's unfair to sit back while the same people work so hard year after year.

Why not take the lead yourself in some major church project this year (or next)? After all, what's good for the geese (in this case) should be good for the Christians!!



Luke 2 (NIV)

The Birth of Jesus

2 In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own town to register.

⁴So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, ⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the

Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

²¹On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise the child, he was named Jesus, the name the angel had given him before he was conceived.
