Do you remember these words from Psalm 42 describing the thirst for something greater?

As a deer longs for flowing streams, So my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the Living God. (Psalm 42:2)

#### Chautauqua Lake Aquatic Herbicide Treatment Monitoring

Region 9 fisheries staff accompanied the pesticides unit in monitoring of the 2019 Chautauqua Lake aquatic herbicide treatment from May 15th to May 17th. Recently issued permits allowed for the treatment of over 400 acres of aquatic vegetation to reduce invasive Eurasian watermilfoil and Curly leaf pondweed. Permit review and treatment monitoring are important aspects of aquatic herbicide use to protect critical fish habitat on one of New York's top freshwater fisheries. Fisheries staff provided the boat and spent 3 days on the lake monitoring



found at this time but it is expected that native vegetation will replace the invasive vegetation in the treatment areas. Follow up monitoring will be conducted to confirm these expected results and future herbicide applications will be highly dependent on this monitoring.

#### Allegheny River Sauger Restoration Update

The Allegheny River sauger re-introduction stocking program that began in 2014 has been extended for another 5 years. Sauger fry were donated from WV and KY in mid-April and were held and raised at the Chautauqua fish hatchery until stocking. This year sauger fingerlings were chemically marked with Oxytetracycline before stocking to allow for evaluation of natural reproduction over the next 5 years. On June 13th, 3,020 pond-reared sauger fingerlings, averaging 1.9 inches, were stocked in the Allegheny Reservoir. This adds to the total of over 20,000 fingerlings that have been stocked since 2014.

In early April, two days of electrofishing were conducted by DEC and the Seneca Nation on the Allegheny Reservoir and lower river to look for sauger staging to spawn. No sauger were caught or observed during sampling, and river conditions prevented additional efforts to look for sauger. Although no sauger were collected this year, two adult female sauger in pre-spawn condition were collected in early spring of 2018. Spawning aggregations of sauger from the first few years of stocking are expected to be seen over the next few years. Fall electrofishing surveys of the reservoir have indicated good survival and exceptional growth of stocked sauger, both encouraging signs for the program. Further evaluation of the sauger population in the river and the reservoir will be conducted over the next 5 years with hopes of documenting natural reproduction.
