There is a small country in Europe named Macedonia. St. Paul traveled there and spread the Good News about Christ our Lord. Many people accepted Jesus as their Savior and several churches were started. Sadly, St. Paul wrote to Christians living in Corinth, Greece, telling about some sort of affliction the Macedonians were suffering. Paul did not say what the trouble was but what impressed Paul was they did not let their troubles kill their joy. In fact, the Macedonians enjoyed being Christians so much that they begged Paul to take a gift of money to use to tell others about salvation.

Paul told the Corinthians about how generous the Macedonians had been. Even though the Macedonians were mostly poor, they had given cheerfully, not begrudgingly. He wanted the Corinthian Christians to know that "God loves a cheerful giver." Someone may ask, "Does not God love everybody?" The answer is "Yes, of course!" But those who give of themselves readily, cheerfully, generously discover a certain satisfaction, a sense of well-being, they had not known before. Paul compares what we reap in life to what we sow. If we sow love, good will, and gifts to God meagerly, we will reap meagerly. On the other hand, if we sow love, good will, and gifts to God generously, we will reap bountifully.

As Paul put it to the Corinthians: "God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work."

The September issue of *Stewardship* has a story about farmers or gardeners who plant small-size potatoes. Of course, they reap small-size potatoes. Planting big potatoes results in harvesting big potatoes. Paul wrote: "...the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully."

Prayer: Dear Lord, enable each of us to discover the joy which comes from generous giving." **Amen.**



At the end of the month, the family with the most bags given will receive a prize. Greetings everyone;

Again, I was blessed to make my 3rd trip to Guatemala for the Impacto Ministry in San Juan, Guatemala with a team of 11 from Cuba and 14 from Avon Wesleyan churches. When we arrived, we were teamed up with another team from Michigan and Illinois. There was a total of 38 team members.

As in last year, we ministered to the abuetos (the elderly) had the children in Happy Tummies program and a sewing ministry to 16 women. This year's sewing project was making fleece vests for adults and children. This went very well with the ladies and we plan on doing it again next year.

We had the opportunity to visit classrooms in San Juan and also in Panachel. Panachel is a poorer village further in the mountains from San Juan. The elementary children are not taught English until high school. The kids received us very well, played a song for us and also prayed for us. The children were given the bible story of when Jesus told the disciples to let the children come to him. One child asked why the disciples didn't want Jesus to be with the kids. The message was the disciples though that the children would bother him or disrupt him. Jesus wanted the children to know that they are important to him also.

I am happy to report that the library at Happy Tummies in San Juan is completed and there are 5 laptop computers there, books, desks for everyone to use. In San Juan the impacto ministry is in the process of building a center for the abuetos so they can have a place to go for the entire day and get feed 3 meals instead of one.

We also made several homes visits and brought food for the families. In one home there may be 5 or 6 people sharing one bed to sleep on. One family had 2 sick children with the measles. This was an eye opening to me, as I didn't realize that many children aren't vaccinated.

As I plan to go again next year, I will be going to ask for donation of wash clothes, bath towels, deodorant, toothpaste, soap and toothbrush so we can make hygiene kits. We are going to do the fleece sewing project again, so I will be asking for donations for that also.

Thank you for supporting me in this mission with the Wesleyan church.


