August Mission trip in San Juan , Guatemala.

Thank you for the prayers and support for this mission in Guatemala. Dakota and 1 went with a team from North Park Wesleyan church in Cuba,NY and Avon Wesleyan Church. There a total of 19 and we were grouped with a team from Michigan – a Methodist church group which the Pastor leader called the Michigan Misfits. The Michigan team had a medical team and construction team. Our team was assigned to care for the Abueltos (elderly) and the school children at Happy Tummies.

Our day started with the Abueltos in the morning serving them a hot breakfast, doing a bible study and crafts/exercise/ games. I was with Joyce( my leader) in the sewing ministry, teaching the ladies to make vests out of fleece. Dakota was assigned to construction of monkey bars on the Happy Tummies playground under the leadership of Andy (Avon group). There he learned how to dig pole holes, make cement from scratch, use some power tools. In the afternoon we had the school kids in which we served them a hot meal, gave a bible story and played games, sang songs and crafts.

We had the opportunity to go on home visits which we presented bags of food, hygiene kits, and prayed for the families we visited. We visited families in San Juan and in Panabar which is located in the mountains (1½ hour bus ride) The families in Panabar are more poorer than the families in San Juan. The one family we visited the woman has 9 children, she usually walks 2½ hours to get into San Juan so she can attend the sewing ministry. She sells wood to get money to take transportation into the village. It costs her 50 Ques (\$7.00) a trip. The average income a week is 350ques (\$49.00)

It is interesting of the behavior in San Juan and in Panabar- the children in Panabar are more malnourished, shorter attention span compared to the children in San Juan. There is a Happy Tummies in both locations which provide the children with a daily vitamin and hot meal. In San Juan, the ministry is building a separate location for the Abueltos so they can provide a full day program for them.

I am truly blessed to be able to serve these people and see them every year. These people have so little and they are so appreciative of service and love we give and I receive great more in return. I hope I am physically able to continue to serve in years to come.


